From Father Kasel

Praised be Jesus Christ through Mary!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

This week I continue with the instruction from St. Peter Julian Eymard from his book: *How to Get More Out of Holy Communion*. The goal of this series is to help every Catholic to be continually renewed in the love of Jesus truly present in the Holy Eucharist each time the soul receives Him in this Sacrament of His Love.

What wonderful encouragement St. Peter offers us to draw close to Our Lord Jesus, truly present in the Holy Eucharist, each week, or more often!

One inspiring teaching from St. Peter is that each Holy Communion lets each of us surrender ourselves to Jesus. St. Peter writes, "God's union with us crowns the divine work of rehabilitation accomplished by Communion... Communion is the perfect development, the full unfoldment of the Incarnation, as it is likewise the completion of the sublime Sacrifice of Calvary, renewed each day in the (Holy) Mass. It is in order to be united with His priest and the faithful that Jesus Christ descends to the altar at the Consecration... It is our Lord's desire to communicate Himself to us as abundantly as possible. But each one receives Him according to his capacity and preparation. To the soul that is well prepared, He gives a strength of life, a generous resolution that causes it to vow eternal fidelity to its Spouse. Henceforth it studies His wishes, tries to find ways of pleasing Him. It receives from our Lord that delicate sense by which He discerns the things that are to His Father's glory, the faculty of judging everything from the divine viewpoint. A soul that lacks this delicate perception seeks itself in all things and, even in receiving Communion, thinks only of the sweetness it may draw from our Lord's presence. Delicacy of feeling is the flower of love. To a soul so finely attuned, Jesus Christ gives, moreover, the grace of self-forgetfulness and entire self-surrender. A soul that receives Communion must come to the point of loving our Lord for Himself; must be able to give itself without asking what it will receive in return. He loves little who demands a recompense for everything he does. To live by Jesus for oneself is well and good, but to live by Him and for Him is better... Our Lord wants us to forget about ourselves... So let Communion be the center of our life, of our actions. Live in order to receive Communion, and receive Communion in order to live a holy life and give glory to God within you. He will one day give you glory beyond telling in the blissful eternity that is His."

Another helpful principal offered by St. Peter is that prayer is essential to fruitful Communion. St. Peter wrote: "We must live on the Eucharist. The Eucharist is love, nothing but love; therefore, we must perfect this love within us, continually renewing its fire, so that we ourselves may be enkindled by it. Love must be made strong in our hearts before we may expect to make it manifest in good works. Since we receive Incarnate Love (Jesus in the Eucharist) so often, our whole life should be simply the development and unfoldment of this love. But if we do not take pains to bring love to perfection in our hearts, we shall never make any progress. Let us be true disciples of Jesus Christ and live by love. The Holy Spirit has breathed the spirit of love into our hearts; let us love, then, bounteously, generously, and royally!... The Eucharist is the fruit of the love of Jesus Christ, and the heart is the seat of love. In order to make us realize this truth, our Lord does not let us see Him but remains in the Holy Eucharist, imperceptible to the senses; we neither

perceive His Body nor taste His Blood. He wants us to go on and find His love in the depths of His Heart... Only in prayer do the fruits of virtue ripen; only in prayer are they harvested. By prayer, a soul may save the world, because it is united with Jesus Christ, who prays within His tabernacle... Never think the time you pass in front of the tabernacle is time taken from good works; not until the grain is covered by the furrow does its fecundity appear. Intimacy with the Holy Eucharist is the seed of virtue."

One benefit of Holy Communion, as taught by St. Peter, is that union with Christ sanctifies our actions. St. Peter wrote: "By Communion, Jesus comes to take possession of us and make us His. To enter into His plan, we must abandon to Him all rights over and all ownership in ourselves; we must leave to Him the direction and initiative of our all our acts; we must do nothing by ourselves nor for ourselves, but everything by and for Him. Saints of the Week:

November 1st - All Saints Day: From as early as 100 years after Christ, the Church has honored the memory of the dead and offered prayers for them. On November 1st, we honor all those who have gone to heaven. The Catholic Church has officially recognized over 10,000 people who are in heaven, after going through a rigorous canonization process.

In the home: November 1st is a Holy Day of obligation. Be sure to attend Mass and say the Litany of the Saints asking those in heaven to pray for us. A fun thing to do is have your children dress up as their favorite saint and attend an All Saints Party. This year, there is one at Resurrection Church in Rochester at 5:00 p.m. Everyone is welcome.

November 2nd - All Souls Day: According to Catholic belief, the soul of a person who dies can go to one of three places. The first is heaven, where a person who dies in a state of perfect grace and communion with God goes. The second is hell, where those who die in a state of mortal sin are naturally condemned by their choice. The intermediate option is purgatory, which is thought to be where most people, free of mortal sin, but still in a state of lesser (venial) sin, must go. Although not a Holy Day of Obligation, All Souls Day is a day to pray for all our loved ones who have died and the souls in purgatory.

In the home: Visit a cemetery where loved ones are buried or the St. Michael's Cemetery and say prayers for the dead. Have your children write the names of deceased loved ones on a piece of paper and decorate it. Say a simple prayer, "For xxxx, may he or she rest in peace." Another nice thing to do is dig out some old photos and talk about your decease loved ones with your children and pray for them to go to heaven.

- pray for the intentions of the Supreme Pontiff.
- 1)The Sacrament of Confession 20 days before or after the pious work of mercy or prayerful action;
- 2) Holy Communion received 20 days before or after the pious work of mercy or prayerful action;
- 3) Pray for the Holy Father as part of each Plenary Indulgence (Our Father and Hail Mary are suggested)

Suggested prayer for a visit to a cemetery: 'Eternal rest grant unto them O Lord; and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace. Amen. May all the souls of the faithful departed rest in peace. Amen.
