From Father Kasel

Praised be Jesus Christ through Mary!

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ Jesus,

I want to again thank all those who supported our 2016 Youth Mission Trip through your prayers and financial gifts! I want to especially mention CJ Auto of Pine Island for the use of one of their vehicles! May God reward you!

All are invited: please mark your calendars for the annual St. Paul CCW Salad Luncheon to be held Wednesday, August 17, 2016 from 11am to 1pm! This will be my sixth Salad Luncheon as your pastor and I have learned to look forward to this wonderful event. Thank you – ahead of time – to all those who are planning the event, signed up to volunteer or will make donations for the Salad Luncheon. It takes many people to make a special event like this happen – if you have not yet signed up, please do so soon!

The month of August is traditionally dedicated to growing in our devotion the Immaculate Heart of Mary. During the month of August I will share more information with you about this wonderful devotion. This Sunday, I share with an excerpt from the classic spiritual book: True Devotion To Mary written by St. Louis de Montfort. I recommend this book to you by St. Louis de Montfort. Pope St. John Paul II read this book early in his life and he openly commented on how it changed his life for the better. In fact, he took his papal motto: 'Totus Tuus' ('Totally Yours' – referring to devotion to the Blessed Mother) from the teachings in this book.

This excerpt is taken Article III: The Necessity of the Blessed Virgin and of Devotion to Her "Providential Function of Mary in the Latter Times"

49. It was through Mary that the salvation of the world was begun, and it is through Mary that it must be consummated. Mary hardly appeared at all in the first coming of Jesus Christ, in order that men, as yet but little instructed and enlightened on the Person of her Son, should not remove themselves from Him in attaching themselves too strongly to her. This would have apparently taken place if she had been known, because of the admirable charms which the Most High had bestowed even upon her exterior. This is so true that St. Denis the Areopagite tells us in his writings that when he saw our Blessed Lady, he would have taken her for a Divinity, because of her secret charms and incomparable beauty, had not the faith in which he was well established taught him the contrary. But in the second coming of Jesus Christ, Mary has to be made known and revealed by the Holy Spirit in order that, through her, Jesus Christ may be known, loved and served. The reasons which move the Holy Spirit to hide His spouse during her life, and to reveal her but little since the preaching of the Gospel, subsist no longer.

7.
